

ASPIRE Day - 15th July 2019

Our Summer ASPIRE Day on 15th July 2019 saw pupils engage in a wealth of activities.



Year 7 pupils engaged in a range of character-building activities doing practical first aid gaining vital life-saving skills. They took part in orienteering and also looked at sustainability and environmental awareness in the local community. Year 7 met representatives from Animal Aid and from Infinity Initiatives, educating pupils about the work of the local food bank. Year 8 pupils engaged in two different STEM workshops with Cadent. Firstly building models of a gas network from the beach to the meter and responding to problem-solving tasks and secondly playing the role of the person dispatching jobs













and creating schedules for employees. Year 8 attended a workshop run by Tameside College which explained to them the range of vocational courses and apprenticeships available to them. They attended a session about planning a pathway to University taking on board planning for Options, GCSEs, A Levels and BTEC courses and considering different types of degrees, the variety of accommodation available and also student finance. The Army outlined the range of jobs available, not just on the front line and Access Creative inspired pupils with a wide range of opportunities in Music.





Year 9 pupils had the opportunity to leave school and take part in a workplace visit. Pupils were asked to investigate and consider job roles and responsibilities within organisations, working hours, holidays, a typical working day, qualifications and training, health and safety and equal opportunities and to reflect on skills and qualities needed. Groups visited Sainsburys, Brother, Findel Education, Willow Wood Hospice



and Ashton Fire Station. One group, based in school, explored the roles of

catering, the site staff, admin, finance, exams, data, teaching and leadership.



Year 10 attended talks given by two of our parents, Mara McKenna, Regional Director of EMEA and

Heather Abbott, a Bid Manager for top law firms. Pupils were given information on apprenticeships by the Growth Company and had their fitness tested by Elite Army Skills through a range of challenges. Pupils also attended sessions on taking a gap year

and careers in law. The police explained the different routes into the police and gave pupils a flavour of the challenges of the job and explained to pupils what have gave them job satisfaction.
